Meals on Wheels is a Life Changer

Corrine had been teaching 18 years at a private school, when she suddenly began tripping, falling and dropping things uncontrollably. Soon after medical tests revealed that Corrine had MS, she was informed that her clumsiness during the school day was "scaring the children." Heartbroken, Corrine felt she needed to quit her job.

Shopping and preparing food became increasingly difficult, so Corrine resorted to frequently purchasing



meals from McDonald's and Subway, and making due with "bits and pieces here and there." When her doctor informed Corrine and the DMV that she was no longer capable of driving, she didn't know what was next. "It's scary being disabled and single and not knowing what's going to happen to you," she said.

Lonely, isolated and now nearly immobile, Corrine desperately needed help. Thankfully, Corrine's social worker connected her with SeniorServ's Meals on Wheels. That connection was life changing for Corrine. She explained, "Going from French fries and burgers for a week straight (or cookies and crackers) to getting real food was a godsend. Really, it was!" SeniorServ's volunteers also help by easing Corrine's loneliness. She said, "The drivers showing up make so much difference in my world and so does the friendly visitor coming. You have no idea... Just walking in the door means the world to me. They want to help. They ask, 'Is there anything we can do? Are you okay'? That is such an incredible service. If it wasn't for SeniorServ, I feel that I just couldn't make it anymore. SeniorServ is really like a family to me because they rally around me when I need them, and I never had that before."

Volunteer's Talents Stir Memories



Rosemary has been generously sharing her musical talents with SeniorServ's Adult Day Care (ADC) Center twice monthly for over seven years. With each volunteer performance, Rosemary strikes a chord with participants of SeniorServ's ADC in Buena Park. The use of music to awaken memories, reduce anxiety, relieve depression and ease agitated behavior in dementia patients has been supported by numerous studies, and as Rosemary strums her guitar and sings old time favorites, "lost" memories flicker in the

eyes of the older adults engaged in her program. Many in the group are inspired to participate as song books and percussion instruments are distributed

by Rosemary's side-kick, Joanne. "They love it when I come," said Rosemary. "When I see their toes tapping and smiles spreading across the room, I know I'm making a difference."

Located in the Buena Park Senior Center, SeniorServ's ADC utilizes a social model providing supervision, nutrition, and activities for seniors with mild cognitive impairment. 

Lunch Program Lifts Spirits

Participants of SeniorServ's Senior Center Lunch Program know Frank as a happy-go-lucky guy who loves to dance and joke around. When he's alone, however, Frank doesn't feel like the jokester everyone at the lunch program knows and loves. Mornings are especially lonely for Frank, but he is grateful that when he's feeling low, his outlook can be transformed by focusing on the day's activities and SeniorServ's lunch at the local senior center.

Frank is comforted seeing a wide variety of familiar faces. "The people are always kind, patient and understanding, and I feel safe," he said. "I offer a lunch donation whenever I can, but it's great to know if I don't have money I can still have lunch." Frank generously expresses his gratitude after each meal by writing "thank you" daily on a comment slip. "We are really very lucky here," said Frank. "Some other countries depend entirely on family and don't have anything for older folks who live alone."

Frank first learned of SeniorServ's Senior Center Lunch Program two years ago in Anaheim. Since then, the sixty-nine-year-old has enjoyed SeniorServ's lunch every weekday, alternating between centers in Anaheim, Fullerton, Tustin, Orange and Garden Grove. He said, "Whenever I wake up with bad thoughts in the morning, I get up and decide which senior center I want to have lunch at. It makes me feel happy knowing I won't be alone anymore."
